SECTION 4: FIRST AID MEASURES

4.1. Description of First Aid Measures

General: Never give anything by mouth to an unconscious person. If you feel unwell, seek medical advice (show the label if possible).

Inhalation: Remove to fresh air and keep at rest in a position comfortable for breathing. Obtain medical attention if breathing difficulty persists.

Skin Contact: Remove contaminated clothing. Drench affected area with water or soap and water for at least 15 minutes. Wash contaminated clothing before reuse. Obtain medical attention if irritation develops or persists.

Ingestion: Wash out mouth with water. Remove victim to fresh air and keep at rest in a position comfortable for breathing. If material has been swallowed and the exposed person is conscious, give small quantities of water to drink. Stop if the exposed person feels sick as vomiting may be dangerous. Do not induce vomiting unless directed to do so by medical personnel. If vomiting occurs, the head should be kept low so that vomit does not enter the lungs. Get medical attention following exposure or if feeling unwell. If necessary, call a poison center or physician. Never give anything by mouth to an unconscious person. If unconscious, place in recovery position and get medical attention immediately. Maintain an open airway.

4.2. Most Important Symptoms and Effects Both Acute and Delayed

General: Causes skin irritation.

Inhalation: May cause respiratory irritation.

Skin Contact: Causes skin irritation. Not classified as corrosive to the skin according to DOT guidelines.

Eye Contact: May cause eye irritation.

Ingestion: May be harmful if ingested in large quantities.

Chronic Symptoms: None expected under normal conditions of use.

SECTION 5: FIRE-FIGHTING MEASURES

5.1. Extinguishing Media
